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Entries: Entries are to be sent to the Oregon Bass and Panfish Club, P.O. Box 1021, Portland, Oregon 97207, Attn.: Contest Director, or to the Club's email address. Entries must be submitted on an Oregon Bass and Panfish Club ENTRY FORM. Entry forms may be downloaded from the website or available at the monthly meetings.

2024 Annual Fishing Contest Rules

1. **A PHOTOGRAPH IS REQUIRED FOR ALL ENTRIES.** The photograph must be a clear side-view of the entire fish and its length measurement as it lays flat on top of the measuring device.
2. Fish must be caught legally by only one person in Oregon or Washington waters open to the public or to all club members, and in accordance with Oregon and Washington Sport Fishing Regulations.
3. All entries must be received within 30 days of catch; fish caught in December must be recorded by January 1st of the following year.
4. Fish can only be entered into either the Boat or the Bank Anglers Contest, but not both. Both contests shall be judged by species and fish length only; longest fish wins per species.
5. All members of OBPC in good standing are eligible.
6. **How to measure:** Close fish's mouth and measure from the tip of the jaw to tip of the tail to the nearest sixteenth (1/16) inch; this is the total length. **Fish must be laid flat on top of the measuring device.**
7. OBPC Contest Director shall have final decision governing all entries.
